- Hā-'Idrā' Zūṭā' Qaddīshā', སヅ̣་བུ་སལ་་ང་་ང་་ང་་ང་་་
 Small Holy Assembly," discourses on the sĕfīrōth to six disciples.
- Hēikhālōth, הֵיכְלּוֹת, "Mansions or Abodes," usually enumerated as seven, describing the structure of the upper and lower realms.
- Midrāsh Han-Ne'ĕlām, בְּנְעְלְם הַנּּעְלְם, "The Hidden Interpretation," deducing esoteric doctrine from the narratives in the Pentateuch.
- Ra'yā' Mĕhēimnā', רֵעְיָא מְהֵימְנָא, "The Faithful Shepherd," recording discussions between Moses the faithful shepherd, the prophet Elijah, and Rabbi Shim'ōn ben Yohai.
- Rāzeī dĕ Rāzīn, רָזֵירְרָזִין, "Secrets of Secrets," a treatise on physiognomy and higher psychology.
- Sābā' dĕ Mishpāṭīm, ཁ་ཁྡལྡལ་ཁུལ་ཁུལ་, "The Aged in Decisions, Judgments"; the Aged One or Scholar is Elijah who discourses with Shim'ōn ben Yoḥai on the doctrine of metempsychosis.

- Sifrā' di-Tsĕnī'ūthā', אָבְיעוּרָאָ הַאָּבִיעוּרָ, "Book of Concealment," discourses on cosmogony and demonology.
- Sithrēi Tōrāh, סְחְרֵי תּוֹרָה, "Mysteries or Secrets of the Law," describing the evolution of the sĕfīrōth.
- Tōseftā', אַסְבְּחָה, "Additions or Supplements."
- Yānūqā', אָנוּקְא, Yĕnōqā', אָנוֹכְן, "The Youth," discourses on the mysteries of ablutions by a young man of such high talent he was thought to be of superhuman origin.
